Benefits of online learning- Online education has benefited the Indian education system in many ways:

- 1. In the current science and technology-oriented era, technology is being used in teaching work to make teaching effective. Therefore it is necessary that every teacher should be proficient in the use of technology. In this way, online learning provides teachers with skill in the use of technology.
- 2. Online teaching is free from the shackles of formalities, under which teachers can do teaching work at any time and at any place.
- 3. Online teaching is benefiting unwell or sick teachers. Unwell or sick teachers can continue their teaching work through online teaching till they are completely healthy.
- 4. Online teaching is beneficial for disabled (physical disability) teachers. Physically handicapped teachers can do teaching work by staying at home through online teaching.
- 5. Through online teaching, teachers can continue their teaching work by staying at home, as a result, situations like congestion on the roads, pressure of vehicles and environmental pollution can be avoided. Thus online learning benefits the environment.
- 6. It is absolutely necessary to have electrical technical equipment for online education. Therefore, as a result of the spread of online education, there is an increase in the demand for electrical technical equipment in the market, which benefits the economy.

Problems of online learning- Various problems related to online education are visible in the Indian education system, they can be divided into two parts for the convenience of study-

(a) Educational Problems

- 1. There is a lack of direct interaction between teacher and students in online teaching. Thus online learning appears to be one-way.
- 2. Due to local conditions in India, there is a lack of conducive environment for online teaching, as a result teachers are indifferent and uncomfortable for online teaching.
- 3. Electrical technical equipment is used for online teaching, but the electrical technical equipment used in online teaching harms the health (eyes, visibility etc.) of teachers and students.
- 4. Through online teaching, knowledge of subjects of theoretical nature can be provided to the students, but online teaching is not suitable for subjects of practical nature.

(b) Technical Problems

- 1. Good and high speed network is the essential condition of effective online learning, but in most areas of India, the problem of good and fast speed limit network is prevalent.
- 2. For online teaching, it is necessary for teachers to have technical knowledge, but in India, a section of teachers lacks basic technical knowledge.
- 3. It is necessary to have uninterrupted power supply for the operation of essential technical and electrical equipment for online education, but uninterrupted power supply is a formidable problem in most areas of India.

4. It is absolutely necessary to have technical and electrical equipment for online teaching, but a section of teachers or students in India lacks these technical and electrical equipment.

Classroom Teaching

Since ancient times, there has been a Guru-Shishya tradition in India, under which Rishi-Muni, discharging the role of Guru, used to impart education to the disciples in their ashram (Gurukul). But as a result of social change, the nature of teaching also changed because teaching is a social process and the work of teaching was done in the classrooms by trained teachers. Thus, classroom teaching is the traditional form of teaching.

Classroom teaching refers to providing education to the students in the actual classroom.

Benefits of classroom teaching

Classroom teaching has benefited the Indian education system in many ways-

- 1. In classroom teaching, teachers and students are directly present in the class, due to which there is a direct interaction between them during teaching, as a result, the effectiveness of teaching increases because the effectiveness of teaching is dependent on the direct interaction between teachers and students.
- 2. Classroom teaching is suitable for teaching subjects of practical nature, in which the students should be taught theoretically. Along with the theoretical knowledge, practical knowledge can also be imparted.
- 3. It is well known that students are most influenced by the personality of the teacher. In classroom teaching, the teacher and the students are directly involved in the class, as a result the personality of the teacher influences the students and paves the way for the development of their personality.
- 4. Classroom teaching is suitable for those teachers who are not able to make efficient use of teaching technology.
- 5. In classroom teaching, teachers are directly present in the class on time so that they follow a regular routine.

Problems of Classroom Teaching

There are many problems related to classroom teaching in the Indian education system-

- 1. India is a large population dominated nation whose influence is reflected on the education system of India. In India, under classroom teaching, students take education beyond the standard from the classes, due to which the teacher is not able to observe all the students present in the class, as a result, the effectiveness of teaching is affected.
- 2. In classroom teaching, teachers reach the institute and attend the class, due to which there is an increase in congestion on the roads, pressure of vehicles and environmental pollution.

- 3. For classroom teaching, disabled teachers have to go to the institute, due to which they suffer physical and mental pain.
- 4. Lecture method is often used by teachers for classroom teaching, due to which the teaching remains one-way and monotonous.
- 5. Teachers often do not use technology during classroom teaching, as a result they are unable to make themselves capable of efficient use of technology, but in the current technologically dominant era, knowledge of efficient use of technology is necessary.
- 6. Classroom teaching is unsuitable for sick or unwell teachers. When teachers are sick or unwell, they are not able to attend the teaching work in the class, due to which their teaching work gets hampered.

Conclusion: - India is a developing nation. Two forms of teaching are reflected in the Indian education system- online teaching (new form of teaching) and classroom teaching (traditional form of teaching). Although both these forms of teaching have their advantages and problems, but just as advantages and limitations are two sides of the same coin, in the same way online teaching and classroom teaching are also full of benefits and problems. Therefore, it is necessary for this that the Indian education system should be benefited from the benefits of both these forms of teaching while solving the problems of online teaching and classroom teaching. So that the education system can be made purposeful and effective. Hence it can be said in conclusion, "A teacher should discharge his teaching work in a mixed form of online teaching and classroom teaching for effective teaching." "Online teaching is an adjunct to traditional classroom teaching, not a substitute for it."
